Name of Alliance/Authority/Client	Herefordshire Council
Project Description	 Herefordshire had previous experience of running a successful LEAN project looking at their parks and open spaces, from which they had identified that the methodology could be more widely applied. This directly led to Herefordshire developing a brief for the creation of a 'World Class Highways' health check model with Improvement and Efficiency West Midlands. The objective of the brief was to develop a re-useable model, based on LEAN, that would allow an Authority to: Assess how close their service is to 'world class'. Develop solutions to close the gaps. Plan how to implement the solutions.
Outcomes and benefits	Based on the assessment of the current service described above Herefordshire elected to re-procure their highway service, with the evaluation criteria for the procurement informed by what had been learned. The procurement process has now been completed and Balfour Beatty selected. The new service design is expected to improve service quality and save circa £2m per annum for Herefordshire. The 'world class' highways model allowed a review of the whole service using a LEAN approach to the assessment. The model wll be re-applied once the implementation of the new service design with Balfour Beatty is completed, and it is recommended to other authorities that a review of your whole service using the 'world class' Highways model can help you to identify opportunities and plan how best to realise them.
